



Communion Reflection...One of my favourite photographs is of my nephew. In it, he just turned one and has been given an entire birthday cake to eat in the way that only a one year old can. His eves are wide as he takes it all in, as if he cannot believe the immensity of it. Our understanding of divine grace—the undeserved love of God-must be something akin to my nephew's understanding of that cake. And "grace upon grace," well, that must somehow be something even more wondrous. With advent right around the corner, now is a wonderful time to repent and recall our sins, but such soul-searching recollection is meaningless outside of our faith in God's grace, which waits for us to show up at the table and dig in, a wide grin across our faces for all that we have been given so freely.



Seeing's not the same as observing. Seeing is PASTOR'S automatic; observing isn't. Observing takes time and thought. When we observe, we're seeking to understand what and who we see. Paul saw things in Athens. But if he was to get a hearing for Jesus, he

had to observe the Athenians, what they valued, what they didn't. When he spoke, he wasn't criticizing them; it was more like he was saying, "I get it. I worshipped my own piety and you worship these objects throughout your city. Now can we talk about the One you're missing?" True observing seeks to understand what others are going through. Everyone's going through something. In view of the way God observes us—as panicked sheep without a shepherd—we see to observe others, trying to find ways to bring Jesus to them. God observed us before we were even born. He had compassion on us. He knew Zacchaeus would be in that tree. He'd observed him from afar (Luke 19:1-10). Now it is our turn to rest our eyes on those God wants us to see and open their eyes to the message of salvation in Jesus.
