

Communion Reflection...At first glance, the two themes for this Sunday seem incompatible. How do you correlate the joy and celebration of Jesus' triumphal procession into Jerusalem with the harsh realities of the passion reading, where we see his tortured body hanging with outstretched arms on that cruel cross? On that joyous Palm Sunday, Jesus was met with shouts of "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" But his kingly throne was not to be in Jerusalem. Five days later, inscribed on his triumphant cross were the fitting words, "This is the King of the Jews." Ironically, that tortuous cross was Jesus' true and glorious throne—and the source of our eternal joy. Because he willingly bore the crown of sin and shame, we who look with faith to the crucified Christ will receive the crown of life. What a glorious day it will be when we meet the King of Kings, seated on his glorious throne!

The special Jubilee Year of Saint Francis proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV will take place from 10 January 2026 to 10 January 2027, on the occasion of the eighth centenary of the death of Saint Francis of Assisi. St. Francis Prayer...Lord, make me an instrument of your love. Where the darkness of loneliness reigns let me bring the light of friendship. Where the darkness of bitterness reigns let me bring the light of forgiveness. Where the darkness of hurt reigns let me bring the light of healing. Where the darkness of discord reigns let me bring the light of harmony. Where the darkness of sadness reigns let me bring the light of joy. Where the darkness of doubt reigns let me bring the light of faith. Where the darkness of despair reigns let me bring the light of hope. And where the darkness of hatred reigns let me bring the light of love.

Fasting and Feasting...Lent is more than a time of fasting, it can also be a joyous season of feasting. Lent is a time to fast from certain things, and to feast on others...Fast from judging others, Feast on the Christ dwelling in them. Fast from emphasis on differences, Feast on the unity of life. Fast from darkness, Feast on the light. Fast from thoughts of illness, Feast on the healing power of God. Fast from words that pollute, Feast on words that purify. Fast from discontent, Feast on gratitude. Fast from anger, Feast on patience. Fast from pessimism, Feast on optimism. Fast from worry, Feast on gratitude.

During the next seven days, we complete our journey toward glory. So often we hear, "Don't blame me for not speaking up. I'm not going to risk my job and reputation." The cries of innocence and excuses of people today sound like Pontius Pilate, claiming to be innocent of Jesus' blood. He agonized over his decision to condemn an innocent man, but he wasn't going to risk his job and reputation. But before we condemn Pilate, or someone we know, for not getting involved or doing the right thing, we must examine our own hands and selfish hearts. We are anything but innocent when it comes to standing up for what is good and right and true in God's sight, especially if it involves risks that may cost us in the end. All of our guilty stains are what led Jesus to that blood-stained cross, where his bloody hands and bleeding heart absorbed all our guilt and shame, so that we can live under the shadow of his cross—free and forgiven and unafraid forever.



Holy Thursday On this day, Jesus offered the very first Mass, fed His followers for the first time with the Holy Eucharist and ordained the first priests. He showed the depth of His love by washing the feet (the act of a servant) of His apostles, and urged us to do the same. After Mass on this night, we take time to adore Jesus in the Eucharist and thank Him for His great love.

Good Friday Because of the wonderful act of love that Jesus performed, giving His life that we might all be able to live forever in His kingdom of love, peace and grace. We kiss the cross and try to understand why anyone would care so much about us.

Holy Saturday Also known as "Holy." Tonight, those who have been preparing to become Christian accept Baptism and Confirmation. On this night we keep watch for the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead and sing the first "Gloria" and "Alleluias" of the Easter Season. We ring the bells to announce the Resurrection and the promise of new life. We all renew the vows of our Baptisms. May each of these days be special to us. May we each be prepared through Penance to receive the new life promised us by Christ. And may the Good Shepherd bless our parish family with special love and peace.
